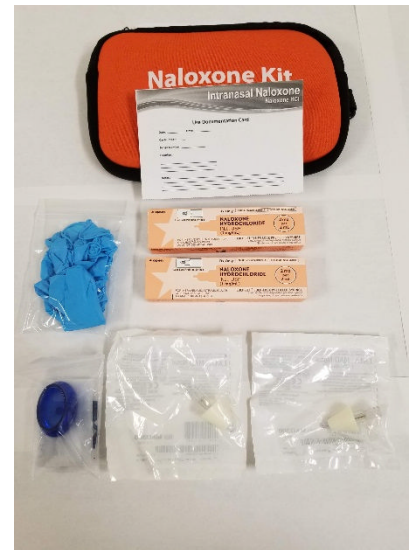
Help Reverse an Opioid Overdose and SAVE LIVES

As the Opioid crisis continues to grow, Opioid overdose deaths are devastating families and communities across our country. Here in Hudson County we want to help lower those numbers by training people on the use of Naloxone (NARCAN) which is a medication designed to rapidly reverse an opioid overdose.
